## **Rules & Conditions**

#### Entries

- a. Exhibitors should use the appropriate Entry Form.
- b. Entry Form together with a fee of £2.00 per adult (to cover <u>all</u> entries) to be placed in an envelope and put in the box at either Milford News, 19 High Street, or The Village News, 74 High Street, no later than 4.30pm on Wednesday, 25<sup>th</sup> June 2025. Children's entries are free.
- c. **Online entries** should be made at www.milford-on-sea-villageshow.org.uk and must be made before 9 am on **Friday**, **27**<sup>th</sup> **June 2025**.
- d. Not more than one entry is allowed per person in any one class.
- e. Children's classes are open to children up to and including 15 years old.

#### Exhibits

The Hall will be open for reception of exhibits between **5 pm – 6 pm** on **Friday**, **27**<sup>th</sup> **June 2025 and 8.00 am - 10.00 am on Saturday**, **28**<sup>th</sup> **June 2025**.

#### (Exhibitors must be clear of the Hall by 10.15 am)

- a. All flowers and vegetables must be grown by the exhibitor in their own garden or allotment, except those used in Floral Art.
- b. No exhibit may be removed until the awarding of trophies has been completed.
- c. The Committee does not hold itself responsible for loss or damage to exhibits.
- d. Awards may be made or withheld at the discretion of the judges. The decision of the judges shall be final.
- e. A competitor who has won any cup or bowl two years running may not be awarded the same cup or bowl in the third year.
- f. Banksian Medal may not be awarded to the same exhibitor in consecutive years.
- g. Where, in the opinion of the judges, two entries in a class are of equal merit, points for both exhibitors will be for 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> or 3<sup>rd</sup>, as appropriate.
- h. Members of the Committee will be available at any time to give advice or assistance, if required, on preparing exhibits for the Show.
- i. Prize cards will be awarded for all 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> placed exhibits. Highly Commended cards may be awarded by the judges at their discretion, where appropriate.

## **Notes and Hints for Exhibitors**

- a. Read the **Schedule** and the **Rules and Conditions** carefully. Note the dates and times applicable to entries, staging and removal of exhibits.
- b. On arrival you will find your named entry cards for the sections you have entered. **Please stage your entry in the correct section, then place entry** card <u>face down</u> with exhibit.
- c. All exhibits should be staged as attractively as possible. Vegetables should be clean, washed with a soft sponge and water. Do not use oil or grease, please.
- d. **Root vegetables** should have leaves removed leaving not more than 8 cm of stem. Show **onions** with tops cut to about 10 cm and tied over. Allow time to ripen and clean back to an unbroken skin. Only the outer, ragged skins, are to be removed. Prepare **shallots** similarly and show them as separate bulbs.
- e. **Tomatoes** should be uniform and have calyx (stalk) left on, as should **strawberries and raspberries**. Fruit is enhanced by its natural bloom, so try not to handle too much.
- f. **Rhubarb:** Top foliage should be cut off leaving 75 mm from start of leaf stalk.
- g. All round or oval shaped **vegetables**, **peas**, and all **fruit** entries should be shown on a suitably sized plate.
- h. All long and bulky entries are to be exhibited on the table.
- i. **Floral art (classes 40 43 inclusive):** Artificial material is **not** allowed for displays. Plant stems should be in natural water-retaining material, wherever possible.

The Judges' decisions are final, but in the event of any query you may ask questions of the Stewards, who will do their best to give you a satisfactory answer. A list showing the Judges' names will be displayed at the Show.

- 31. Rose 1 specimen bloom, no buds (foliage may be left on to be judged solely on its beauty as a single bloom)
- 32. Sweet Peas (annual) one vase 12 stems (own foliage)
- 33. Shrubs in bloom one vase **3** stems one or more varieties (*roses excluded*)
- 34. Pelargonium Pots not to exceed **20 cm** inside top diameter (plants must have been owned for at least three months by exhibitor)
- 35. Flowering House Plant (*excluding orchids*) Pot not to exceed **20 cm** inside top diameter (*plants must have been owned for at least three months by exhibitor*)
- 36. Orchid Pots not to exceed **20 cm** inside top diameter (*plants must have been owned for at least three months by exhibitor*)
- 37. A bowl of floating annual flower heads bowl not to exceed **20 cm**
- 38. Cactus / Succulent Pot not to exceed 20 cm inside top diameter
- 39. Patio Pot Pot not to exceed **50 cm** inside top diameter one or more varieties of plant (*must be planted by exhibitor*)

## **SECTION D: Floral Art**

- 41. At The Produce Show (An all-round arrangement of your choice of colour, but must include one or more of vegetables, fruit or herbs (not to exceed W 50 cm x D 50 cm x H 50 cm)
- 42. Coastal Treasures (A petite exhibit presented in a shell (not to exceed W 12 cm x D 12 cm – height optional)
- 43. Earth Wind and Fire (A front facing flower arrangement - accessories may be used – flowers can be bought (not to exceed W 50 cm x D 35 cm x H 75 cm)

### **Gingerbread Loaf**

#### Ingredients

Metric	Imperial
50 g black treacle	2 oz black treacle
50 g golden syrup	2 oz golden syrup
110 g margarine	4 oz margarine
110 g soft dark brown sugar	4 oz soft dark brown sugar
175 g plain flour	6 oz plain flour
1 egg	1 egg
150 ml milk	¼ pint milk
1 level tablespoon ground ginger	1 level tablespoon ground ginger
¼ teaspoon cinnamon	1/4 teaspoon cinnamon
1 level teaspoon bicarbonate of soda	1 level teaspoon bicarbonate of soda
pinch of salt	pinch of salt

#### Method

Heat the oven to 160° C (140° C fan, Gas 3).

Baking time 45-60 minutes.

- 1. Put treacle, syrup, margarine and brown sugar together in a large pan and melt gently over a low heat.
- 2. Sift together flour, spices and salt, then add to the melted mixture. Stir well.
- 3. Warm milk in separate pan and stir in bicarbonate of soda. Add this to the mixture plus the beaten egg.
- 4. Mix well.
- 5. Pour mixture into a lined 2 lb loaf tin and bake for approx.  $\frac{3}{4}$ -1 hour.
- 6. Cool in the tin (to help keep the cake moist).
- 7. If you can, keep for 1 week wrapped in foil, to really improve the taste.
